The courses

These e-learning courses support the implementation of NICE guideline 67 'Managing medicines for adults receiving social care in the community'.

Course 1	Provides a foundation in the essential medicine-related processes that social care providers need to consider.
Course 2	Covers the practical issues related to medicines administration support for all social care workers in a client-facing role, upskilling them to administer different types of medicine formulations.

- Both courses consist of modules, case studies and a final exam with a 70% pass mark.
- On passing the course a certificate of completion will be issued.

The courses are CPD accredited and carry endorsement statements from the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE). PrescQIPP is a Skills for Care endorsed provider of e-learning courses for the adult social care sector.
