# How to access the e-learning

#### Register for an account

- Unless you already have an account you will need to register on the <u>PrescQIPP</u> e-learning platform
- Please select the correct CCG organisation when registering as this will ensure that you are provided with access to the correct courses

#### Log in and get started!

- Log into the PrescQIPP e-learning platform
- Find the course you want to start and select 'Access course'

#### Save your progess and come back later

- All courses consist of modules, case studies and a final exam with a 70% pass mark
- On passing the course a certificate of completion will be issued
- The courses should take between 2-3 hours each and it is recommended that they are carried out in stages rather than one sitting

### About the courses

These e-learning courses support the implementation of NICE guideline 67 'Managing medicines for adults receiving social care in the community'.

Course 1 provides a foundation in the essential medicine-related processes that social care providers need to consider.

Course 2 covers the practical issues related to medicines administration support for all social care workers in a client-facing role, upskilling them to administer different types of medicine formulations.

The Care Quality Commission (CQC) was a stakeholder in the development process of this e-learning. The courses are CPD accredited and carry endorsement



statements from the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE). PrescQIPP is a Skills for Care endorsed provider of e-learning courses for the adult social care sector.
